Reclaim your pastures

THE herbicide GP Flupropanate, has proved effective in the control of serrated tussock and Parramatta grass, and has been involved in its effective use on heavily infested paddocks from Bathurst to the South Coast, and beyond.

John Brotchie from Ag Innovations said autumn is an ideal time to treat your paddocks and give the beneficial pasture grasses a good start when spring comes around.

Flupropanate is a residual herbicide that is taken up by the plants roots.

When applied in liquid form by boom spray it could do damage to more than just the targeted plants, leaving bare patches and killing off otherwise beneficial

species but its granular form is proving an effective weapon against serrated tussock even in large scale application.

Mr Brotchie said that the granular product was more effective even in aerial application. Liquid flupropanate application had an uneven kill rate across a wide area, however the granular form proved much more effective, even in timbered areas, with little effect on native grasses or improved species like legumes, cocksfoot and phalaris.

"The granules fall through the canopy and land on the ground near the target."

In trials on the heavily serrated infested Bannaby Angus properties, where the constant battle to keep the tussock in check has been constant and success

limited, the GP Flupropanate G100 has wiped out nearly all the tussock but left the native pasture. Bannaby Angus manager Glynn Langford, said the clover was thriving just two months after the treatment of the infested pasture.

For smaller areas or spot treatment of serrated tussock on the south coast Parramatta grass, hand spreaders have proved quite effective.

"A 15kg pack goes quite a long way particularly when combating Parramatta grass or hand spreading tussock patches," he said.

"Another great thing about the granular product is that there is no need for mixing, dragging hoses or leaky back packs."
